



## **ADA Medal Award Program** (effective as updated January 1, 2023)

**General Reference for ALL levels:** Eligible shows must be held in Alberta commencing no earlier than January 1, 2021. No time limit or horse restrictions (scores can be achieved on different horses over any number of years).

Applicant must be a member of an ADA area group and a resident of Alberta.

**FEI Equivalencies** are noted in each category as published in the EC Dressage Rulebook 2021. In the event of changes to these equivalencies, the most current EC Dressage Rulebook will be used.

Freestyle tests are not eligible for any Award or Medal.

Rider Performance and a specific Medal can only be received once in a life time.

### **Rider Performance Award:**

- 4 scores of 60.000% or higher from 4 different tests at Training and/or First Level from at least 2 different competitions and 2 different judges (“different tests” means Test #1, #2, #3)
- If all tests are from the same level, submit Test #1, #2, and #3 plus one repeated test of your choice from a different judge or show.
- Your choice of tests must include Test #3 of either Training or First Level
- FEI 4-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Training Level so could be used for Training Level Requirement
- Eligible shows: AEF Wild Rose; EC Bronze; EC Silver; EC Gold

### **Bronze Medal:**

- 4 scores of 60.000% or higher
- 2 scores from First Level and 2 scores from Second Level including 2 different tests at each level
- Scores from at least 2 different judges or judging panels
- FEI Pony Tests; FEI Children Tests are equivalent to Second Level so could be used as the Second Level requirement
- FEI 4-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Training Level so could be used for Training Level Requirement
- FEI 5-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Second Level so could be used for Second Level Requirement
- Eligible shows: AEF Wild Rose; EC Bronze; EC Silver; EC Gold; FEI sanctioned

### **Silver Medal:**

- 4 scores of 60.000% or higher
- 2 scores from Third Level and 2 scores from Fourth Level including 2 different tests at each level
- Scores from 2 different judges or judging panels
- FEI Junior tests are equivalent to Third Level so could be used as the Third Level requirement
- FEI 6-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Third Level so could be used for Third Level Requirement
- FEI 7-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Developing Prix St. Georges, FEI Prix St. Georges or Fourth Level, so could be used for Fourth Level Requirement
- Eligible shows: EC Gold; FEI sanctioned



**Definition of “different tests” for Gold Medal and Platinum Medal:** there is only one FEI test published in any given “year” so the scores would be the same “test” but a different “ride” with different judges or judging panel.

**Gold Medal:**

- 4 scores of 60.000% or higher
- 2 scores from PSG and 2 scores from Intermediate I with 2 different judges or judging panels
- FEI Young Rider tests are equivalent to PSG so may be used as the PSG requirement
- FEI 7-Year-Old Tests are equivalent to Developing Prix St. Georges, FEI Prix St. Georges or Fourth Level, so may be used for Prix St. Georges Level Requirement
- Eligible shows: EC Gold; FEI sanctioned

**Platinum Medal:**

- 4 scores of 60.000% or higher
- 2 scores from Intermediate II and 2 scores from Grand Prix OR 4 scores from Grand Prix with 2 different judges or judging panels
- FEI Intermediate A and B tests are equivalent to Intermediate II so may be used as the Intermediate II requirement
- FEI U25 test may be used as the Grand Prix requirement
- Grand Prix Special may be used as the Grand Prix requirement
- Eligible shows: EC Gold; FEI sanctioned

**General Directives for Individual Performance and Medal Awards**

If the test scores are an average of 2 or more judges, the average score must be considered a single score to be used as a requirement.

If a judge was a member of a judging panel on a submitted average score, that judge's score could be used on a different submitted score on a different test if that judge was adjudicating alone. If two scores are submitted from two judging panels, Panel #1 could be Judge A and B, and Panel #2 could be Judge A and C. Note Judge A is the same person but judging with a different partner.

Copies of Tests must accompany the Submission Form in order to validate scores. Scans of tests should include: name of test; name of rider; name of show; date of show; percentage achieved; name of judge(s). To apply for the Rider Performance Award or Medal Awards, the Submission Form and copies of applicable tests will be sent to the ADA Awards Committee upon completion of the Award requirements.
