2019 Horse & Rider Recognition Awards

Bronze Awards

Criteria

1. The rider of the horse must be a member of an area group of the Alberta Dressage Association by the date of their award submission or November 30th of the current year. The ADA area groups include: Chinook Country/Alberta Dressage Association; Calgary Area Alberta Dressage Association; Cold Lake Alberta Dressage Association; Edmonton Area Alberta Dressage Association; Parkland Area Alberta Dressage Association; Peace Region Alberta Dressage Association and Alberta Junior Young Riders Dressage Association.
2. Each horse and rider combination must apply in the year in which the scores were earned in order to qualify. There is no application fee. Pre-registration before showing is not required.
3. Scores must be earned at Equestrian Canada National competitions (Gold, Silver or Bronze) within Alberta. A maximum of one Gold show with a maximum of 2 judges from that show may be used (i.e. A maximum of 2 scores from one Gold show). (rationale: to promote the Bronze/Silver shows).
4. When there is more than one judge for a class, only the average score will be counted.
5. At Training and First Level, each horse and rider team must earn four scores of 63% or better from at least three different judges. At all subsequent levels, each horse and rider team must earn four scores of 60% or better from at least three different judges.
6. Awards for each horse and rider team may be earned only once at each level. This is a team award; riders and horses may earn multiple awards at each level with another partner.
7. This is an annual award. Each horse and rider team must earn the required number of scores within the current year.
8. FEI Child & Pony tests will count as Second Level, FEI Junior tests as Third Level and FEI YR tests as PSG.
9. FEI Young Horse 4 YO test will count at First Level, 5 YO tests will count as Second Level and 6 YO tests as Third Level.
10. There will be awards for Freestyles at each Equestrian Canada recognized level as well. Each horse and rider team must earn three scores of 62% or better from at least two different judges, at each level.
11. Submission of Application for Award. Bronze Shows are not required to submit scores to Equestrian Canada and may not use an electronic scoring program. Please ensure the following two steps are followed:
 - a. A **Score Report Form** must be submitted by **November 30** of the reporting year. This form can be found on the ADA Website (www.albertadressage.com – FAQ and Forms).
 - b. A **copy of the dressage score sheet that matches the submitted scores must accompany the Score Report Form. This could be one of the following:**
 - i. **Picture of the final score with the signature of the judge, date and name of show included. Please review prior to sending to ensure it is a readable picture.**
 - ii. **Photocopy of the final score sheet that includes signature of judge, date and name of show included.**
