Participation 25+ Years:

Drusilla moved to Lethbridge from Edmonton in 1984, and immediately got involved with the riding community. She was a founding member of the local Chinook Country/CADORA association, and has been an active participating member of CC/ADA ever since. Dru has been an active rider either borrowing, leasing, exercising other's horses, or owning a horse herself. With her own horses, Quincy, Red, and Champ, Dru has participated in local dressage shows and ridden for pleasure or enjoyed trail riding.
