Wild Rose Show General Information

STEP INTO DRESSAGE WILDROSE SHOW is sanctioned as an Alberta Wild Rose Competition: FEI & EC tests, Eventing tests, WDAA tests for Western dressage, Working Equitation (WECAN) dressage tests, Prix Caprilli tests, Pony Club, flat and hack classes are being offered in the Wild Rose Show. Alberta Equestrian Federation Wild Rose sanctioned competitions are to be run in accordance with the AEF Wild Rose Rules. Dressage will follow the rules in Chapter 10 of the AEF rule book.

An AEF membership is required to show in the Wild Rose Show.

ADA/AEF Provincial Circuit Awards Program

- ❖ NEW IN 2025!
- ❖ The Step Into Dressage competition is sanctioned as a Wild Rose Provincial Circuit competition of Alberta Equestrian Federation and will be run in accordance to the AEF Wild Rose Competition Rulebook.
- ❖ Every class offered herein is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Wild Rose Competition Rulebook and will be held and judged in accordance with the Rulebook.
- ❖ When registering for Wild Rose sanctioned competitions, athletes must indicate the name of their coach on the entry form or specify that they are selfcoached.
- ❖ Every participant at the AEF Wild Rose Competition shall agree that the owner, lessee, trainer, manager, agent, coach, driver or rider, and horse shall be subject to the constitution and rules of the competition.
- ❖ Any horse entered in any class at a competition may be selected for equine medication control testing while at the event location.
- ❖ All horses participating in the Wild Rose provincial circuit competition must have received Equine Influenza and Equine Herpes Virus (1&4) vaccinations within the last 6 months, with a 21 day grace period before the event.
- ❖ The competition is required to ensure all competitors, owners, lesser, and person(s) responsible for an entry hold a current AEF membership to ensure each entry is protected by their own liability coverage. Exceptions: Out-of-Province competitors are not required to hold AEF

membership provided they are members of the respective P/TSO and are in good standing. A parent or guardian are not required to have an AEF membership if signing as the person(s) responsible for an entry that is a minor/junior competitor.

Alberta Dressage Association Insurance Requirements

Due to insurance regulations, anyone participating in the Step into Dressage Show must be a member of the ADA. An additional insurance fee payable to the ADA can be obtained with the fees as follows: \$10.00 for a Senior (age 18+) and \$7.00 for a Junior (under 18 years). The additional insurance fee will be forwarded directly to the ADA before the show. If you are already a group member, please make sure to provide your membership number and group affiliation on the entry form.

Masters Test of Choice

The Masters Test of Choice is an Equestrian Canada (EC) dressage class that provides senior riders, 60 years and older, the opportunity to participate in a dressage class that is exclusively their own in an environment that provides a fair playing field for senior riders wherein each will compete against their peers at all levels of skill, from beginners to advanced. The Masters class is not eligible for the AEF Provincial Circuit Awards program.

DETAILS:

1. Masters classes are open to riders 60 years of age and above.
2. Any EC sanctioned dressage competition may offer the Masters Test of Choice.
3. The class will be offered as a Miscellaneous Test of Choice class as per the EC Rules, Section A: General Regulations, A503 and will include all levels, national to FEI.
4. In the event of a large number of entries, the class may be divided into two – lower and upper dressage levels – with separate sets of ribbons.
5. The class will be included in the competition prize list with the appropriate entry fee.
6. The class will feature one test per day and may have a class championship.
7. Scores from Masters classes will not count towards EC championships or awards programs.
8. Masters riders may also compete in non-Masters dressage classes.
9. To facilitate ease of riding, the following accommodations are available in the Masters Test of Choice:
 - a. Rising trot is optional in all trot work.
 - b. Callers/riders may use headsets (someone, e.g., a competition appointed supervisor (E.4.9.A.8. Exception) only, may stand beside the caller to ensure no coaching takes place).
 - c. Entry bell/whistle can have a secondary indicator (e.g., the caller can raise an arm once the bell rings).
 - d. Use of voice
 - e. Equipment accommodations may include any or all of the following: Looped reins; Converters on double bridle to create single rein; Gel or fluffy seat covers; and/or Two whips.
10. Judges for the Masters Test of Choice must be EC certified Dressage Judges at the Basic, Medium or Senior level.

Team Competition

Sign up at the show office on the first day of the competition with your team of 4 rider/horse combinations to compete for awards on Sunday. Top score from each team member will be used in calculation and top overall averaged score will determine team placing.

Iron Horse Cup

The Iron Horse Cup is open to all horse/rider combinations competing in the show. The horse (pony) with the highest overall score will be the 2025 Iron Horse Champion.

The following classes must be entered:

- ❖ Dressage (with one top test over the show used in the Iron Horse tabulations)

- ❖ Prix-Capriilli (with one top test over the show used in the Iron Horse tabulations)
- ❖ Costume
- ❖ Champagne
- ❖ English or Western Pleasure
- ❖ Equitation

Placing Points:

- ❖ 1st Place = 6 points
- ❖ 2nd Place = 5 points
- ❖ 3rd Place = 4 points
- ❖ 4th Place = 3 points
- ❖ 5th Place = 2 points
- ❖ 6th Place = 1 point

Show Rules and Regulations

1. **Avoid Disappointment!** Get your entries in early to avoid disappointment of cancelled classes or late fees. No fees charged to make changes to your entry prior to entry closing date.
2. Entries must be received by June 6, 2025 with full payment. There is one way to enter:
 - a. **Compete Easy starting May 1, 2025.** This allows the use of a credit card to pay for your entries.
3. Entry Cancellations: Prior to closing date of June 6, 2025, will have all fees less the office fee refunded. Cancellations after the closing date of June 6, 2025 and prior to start of show, must present a vet certificate or medical doctor note to receive a refund of stabling and 50% of class fees. There will be no refunds for cancellations received after the start of the show.
4. Entries will be processed in the order that they are received. The show committee reserves the right to limit and/or refuse entries and cancel or combine classes.
5. Horses competing do not require a horse recording.
6. Riders competing do not require EC sport licenses for the rider and the owner. They do all require an AEF and ADA membership.
7. Late entries will be accepted only if space permits and at the show secretary's discretion. Entries accepted after June 6, 2025 will be charged a \$50.00 late fee.
8. Post entries to fill scratches will be allowed if scheduling permits. To be eligible for post entry, the horse/rider must already be registered in the show as either a competing or non-competing horse. Please come to the show office to inquire about post entries.
9. All entries must have the signature of the owner or authorized agent and a signature for the person responsible for the horse. Riders will not be allowed to compete without a signature from a person responsible.
10. Junior riders must have permission to participate in the show as indicated by the signature of a parent or guardian.
11. Hors Concours entries will be accepted with full fees into the show. Entrants are subject to AEF rules for the show. Hors Concours entries are not eligible for ribbons or awards.
12. Non-competing (schooling horses) will be accepted into the Wild Rose Show. Entries must pay the administration fee, a non-competing horse fee and stabling fee or haul-in fee.
13. Horse substitutions are allowed until one hour before the first class the horse is competing in.
14. ***All athletes of the STEP INTO DRESSAGE WILDROSE SHOW, regardless of age or level of competition, must always wear properly fitted and fastened safety approved protective headgear when mounted.***
15. Wild Rose Introductory, Training level, Western Dressage Intro and Basic level, WECAN, Pony Club, Eventing, Rail Classes and Fun Classes may be scheduled in the 20x40 dressage arenas.
16. Entry numbers must always be worn and visible in the schooling area as well as in the

competition rings. Horses to wear halter numbers when out of their stalls for ID purposes.

17. Stabling is optional for competitors of the STEP INTO DRESSAGE WILDROSE SHOW. The stabling fee includes free choice shavings provided by the show. The stabling is not available until 1:00 pm on Thursday (move in day). Please do not plan your arrival before this time. There is ample room for trailer parking and tying to trailers however all parking is on pavement. Horses that do not require a stall must pay the haul in fee.
PLEASE NOTE THE SHOW GETS CHARGED FOR EACH STALL USED, SO DO NOT PUT ANYTHING INTO A STALL THAT YOU HAVE NOT PAID FOR.
18. Power hookups are available and must be booked directly through the Westerner Park Campground. Plugged in trailers and campers will be fined if a valid parking pass is not displayed on your unit. This is fully enforced by Westerner Park.
19. Horses must leave the show grounds within 2 hours of classes ending on Sunday. Any arrangements to stay extra time must be made in advance with the show office.
20. Warm up in the show rings will be allowed on move in day from 2:00 pm until 8:00pm. Horses that are not stabled on the grounds may also haul in on move in day and school in the show rings. Schooling in the show rings is not allowed once the show has started.
21. Lunging will be allowed in a dedicated area outdoors during schooling and show times.
22. The warmup areas are open during the show and schooling times and one hour before the show starts each day and one hour after the show on Friday and Saturday. All arenas close at end of last classes on Sunday.
23. Show correspondence will be handled through email. Ride times will be available via the Compete Easy website. Ride times will also be posted at the show office. **Riders are responsible for checking the day sheets as ride times may change due to scratches.** Please provide a correct email on your entry form!
24. Working Equitation dressage tests are WECAN 2025 tests. Ring size will be 20x40 and riders will follow WECAN rules for tack and Wild Rose rules for all other guidelines and rulings. ***Safety approved protective headgear must be worn by all competitors.***
25. Western Dressage tests are WDAA 2022 tests. Riders will follow WDAA rules for tack and Wild Rose rules for all other guidelines and rulings. ***Safety approved protective headgear must be worn by all competitors.***

Emergency Measures / Biosecurity Protocols

Emergency Procedures

1. In case of emergency, Westerner Park requests that all exhibitors, participants, and event organizers follow the protocols listed below.
 - a. **Inclement Weather (Heavy Rain and Hail):** If stabling tents are going to be compromised, all persons and animals are to seek shelter in the Agricentre. Westerner Park staff will notify show organizers of further action to be taken. All competitors/affiliates are responsible for their own personal belongings.
 - b. **Inclement Weather (Windstorm or Tornado):** All persons and animals are to seek shelter in the Agricentre. Westerner Park staff will notify show organizers of further action to be taken. All competitors/affiliates are responsible for their own personal belongings.
 - c. **Fire:** All persons and animals are to make their way to the nearest muster point. Westerner Park staff will notify show organizers of further action to be taken. Nearest muster point to the Equestrian Center is the "Dirt Storage Shed" – southeast of Agricentre building.
 - d. **Biosecurity/Sick Animals:**
 - i. ***Animals that are suspected of suffering from an infectious or contagious disease or have been in contact with other animals suffering from such disease MUST NOT be brought to Westerner Park.***
 - ii. ***If an animal is showing signs of ailment:***
 1. A veterinarian is to be notified immediately and the animal quarantined and examined. Fees are the responsibility of the

- owner.
- 2. Key personnel are to be notified and briefed about the incident.
- 3. A Bio Security Incident Report must be completed.
- 4. The animal MAY NOT leave the premises until it has been examined by a veterinarian and it has been determined that there is no threat to the biosecurity of the premises (contagious).
- iii. An animal will not be permitted to leave the facility without a signed Livestock Release Form.
 - 1. If a sick animal is not permitted to leave the facility, the animal will be placed in isolation and all areas the animal previously had contact with will be disinfected immediately. The animal must be withdrawn from all competition.
 - 2. Any personnel handling the animal are required to wear disposable gloves, boot covers, and coveralls that will be used only when handling that animal.
- iv. Any equipment used for the care of the animal is to be disinfected following each use.
- v. After the animal leaves the facility, the "isolation stall" and any other areas the animal may have had contact with, will be blocked from public or animal access will be disinfected by Westerner Park. Additional cleaning and sanitization of the area will be charged to the owner.
 - 1. The primary responsibility for biosecurity during events lies with the horse owners.
 - 2. Biohazard containers are available in each stalling area and must be used for the disposal of all biohazard materials and needles. Do not place needles in the trash receptacles or on the floor.
 - 3. It is strongly recommended that ALL horses attending Westerner Park are up to date on vaccines and deworming treatments. All horses being imported from the United States require a negative Coggins test.
- e. **Please – Keep Your Distance!**
 - i. If you are sick or have flu-like symptoms we ask that you please be respectful of others and wear a mask at all times when not on a horse and keep a distance of minimum 6 feet between yourself and others. Send someone else to the show office to collect your tests / ribbons, if possible. Thank you!

PRIZES AND AWARDS

Any horse receiving less than 51% of the total points obtainable in a test shall not be eligible for awards, ribbons or prizes

1. When there is only one horse in a class, ribbons and prizes shall be awarded in accordance with the following percentages:
 - a. 1st = 63% or higher
 - b. 2nd = 60% to 62.9%
 - c. 3rd = 58% to 59.9%
 - d. No ribbons or prizes shall be awarded below 3rd position
2. Class ribbons and show championship ribbons will be distributed at the show office. Class ribbons will be given to 6th place by category of rider (Amateur, Junior, Open) if entries warrant. Organizing committee reserves the right to combine classes.
3. One champion and one reserve champion will be awarded in each of the following levels, if entries warrant. Championship categories may change, depending on entries.
 - a. Introductory (whole show)
 - b. Training / First / Second / Third / Fourth (Jr/AA/Open)

- c. FEI
 - d. Freestyle
 - e. Western Dressage (regular & gaited)
 - f. Pony Club
 - g. Eventing
 - h. Working Equitation Dressage
 - i. Hi Score PAADA Member
 - j. Iron Horse Cup Champion
 - k. Team Challenge Champion
4. Riders must ride 2 different tests during the show in the same level to be eligible for Champion & Reserve ribbons / awards (excluding Freestyle award). In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest single percentage score will be declared the winner

CLASS DESCRIPTIONS & RULES

- ❖ **Prix Caprilli** - A Prix Caprilli is a dressage test with jumps in it. Three Prix Caprilli courses will be set. One test for the novice jumpers will be low cross rails – pattern Prix Caprilli #1. The second course for the more experienced riders will be set up to 2' – pattern Prix Caprilli #2. The third course for advanced riders will be set up to 2'6" – pattern Prix Caprilli #3. Iron Horse points assigned based on placing and percentages.
- ❖ **Lead Line Child Equitation (English or Western, Walk/Trot)** – To be shown at walk and trot/jog. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat, 40% on rider's correct and effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Restricted to riders who have not reached their 10th birthday on the date of the show. Rider must be accompanied by a leader over the age of 18.
- ❖ **English Pleasure** – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation.
- ❖ **Western Pleasure** – To be shown at walk, jog and lope. Judged 50% on performance, 40% on manners and 10% on conformation.
- ❖ **Equitation (English or Western)** – To be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Judged 40% on rider's position and seat. 40% on rider's correct effective use of the aids and 20% on harmony between horse and rider. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable.
- ❖ **Costume - IRON HORSE CLASS** To be shown at walk and trot. Judged 30% on performance, 10% on manners and 60% on the costume. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable.
- ❖ **Champagne - IRON HORSE CLASS** Riders will be given a glass of "champagne" which they must carry throughout their class. They will be shown at walk, trot and canter, not to gallop. Riders may ride with one or two hands. Rider may show in English or Western tack. Bitless bridles are acceptable. At the end of the class the rider with the greatest amount of "champagne" will be the winner.
